"I repent," *forgive him.*

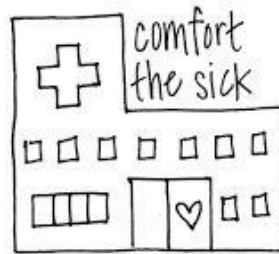

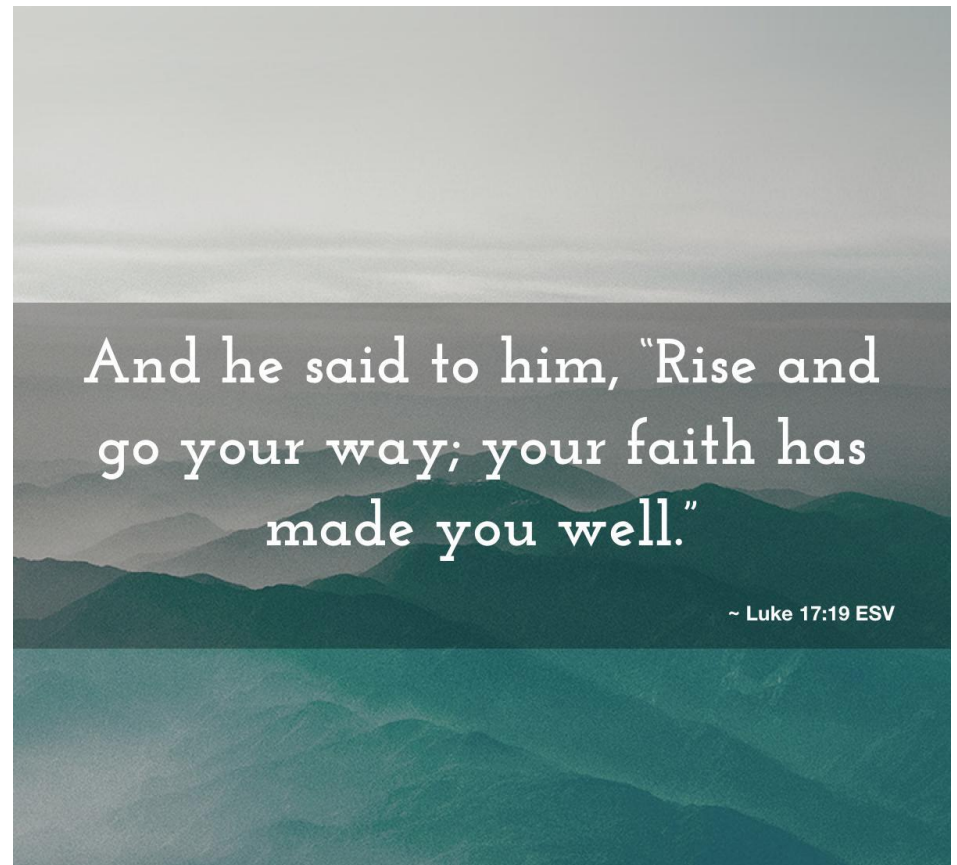
How can we serve Jesus and those around us more today?

Reflection of the Day:

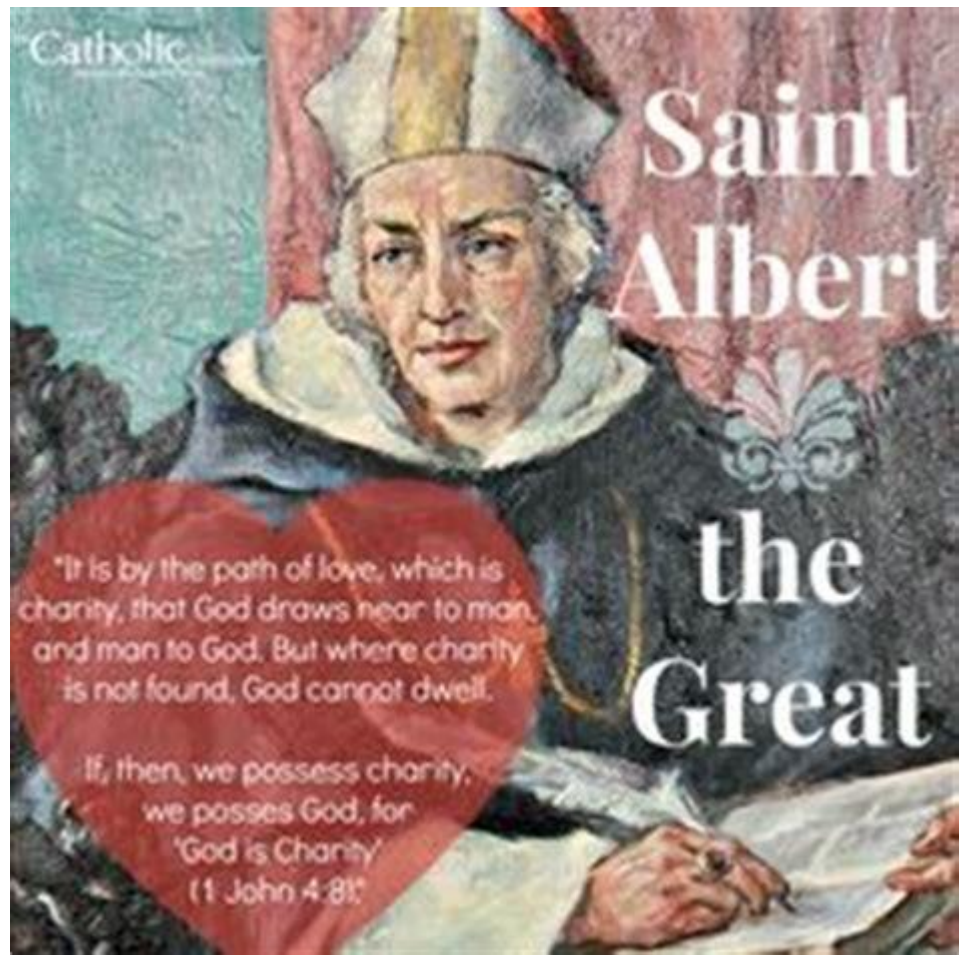
