
Monday 19<sup>th</sup> November

### **Reflection of the Day:**

(Today's Gospel – Luke 18:35-43)


In today's Gospel we see a blind man call out to Jesus as he was passing by. He not only calls out once, but he calls out twice, despite the crowds around him trying to shush him. Jesus stops and asks the people to bring the blind man to him, and there, he asks him what it is he wants. Jesus, although knowing already what the man needs (he was quite visibly blind!) still asked – He still wanted the man to trust him enough to come to him and ask him. Today, what is it you need to ask Jesus for? How can Jesus help you? Don't listen to the voice that tells you to shush, but instead, listen to Jesus who is waiting to hear you call on him.




### Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> November

Today, we pray for hearts like Mary. Hearts that are waiting for you always – open to your will, and open to our neighbours. May we, like Mary, radiate your love today and always.


