Government have provided an official response to the Education Committee report '[Nursing degree apprenticeships: in poor health?](#)' which explores the low numbers of nursing apprentices since the introduction in 2016. The report also explores the wider issue of low numbers entering the profession, this may also be aligned to there no longer being a bursary attached to the nursing degree route.

The first-degree level apprenticeship for town planners has been approved. The apprenticeship is a degree level 7 apprenticeship and combines practical experience with academic study.

[How much do you know about apprenticeships in 2019: what teachers said](#)

Which? University surveyed 90 teachers to explore their knowledge around apprenticeships. 79% of those surveyed agree or strongly agree that they feel equipped to provide good information and support to students about apprenticeships. Although this is positive, the findings also show that some schools feel more informed about university routes than apprenticeships as they have traditionally had more dealings with this. Also some teaching staff are not always as informed on apprenticeships as others.

[The new National Minimum Wage](#)

A reminder that the new national minimum wage comes into effect this month. Any apprentice aged over 22 years of age and not in the first year of their apprenticeship is entitled to the national minimum wage.

[Skills for Londoners Business Partnership](#)


