Important reminders for induction day

- 1. Students must be in primary school uniform

- 3. Students must bring in a (nut free) packed lunch and water bottle
- 4. If your child requires emergency medication, they will need to attend the medical room before they go anywhere else on site. Medical will be open from 8.15. They MUST have their emergency medication with them.
- 5. Finish at 2:50pm

This includes Epipens (with care plan), asthma pumps and any other medication. They can either leave these in medical or keep their box on them.

Without their emergency meds and care plan, students will remain in the medical room until received.

Attendance

- Average attendance = 96.6%
- An attendance rate of 92% or below is classified as a cause for concern
- Where possible make all appointments outside of school hours
- Leave of Absence <u>will not</u> be authorised for family holidays or when it is requested just before or after a school break

If your child is absent, please notify the school no later than 8.30 a.m.

No contact = text/email after 10.30a.m.

2nd day= 2nd text/email

3rd day = phone call

Warning letter once your child's attendance drops below 93%




Punctuality

- If your child arrives late, they will have a LATE stamp in their diary and a 20 minute detention on that day
- 2 lates per week-1 hour detention after school on Friday
- 5 lates in a half term will result in a Saturday detention
- 10 lates in a school year punctuality report and a meeting with the parents
- 15 lates in a school year, students will be required to stay for 40 minutes every day they are late

School Uniform 2022/23

All pupils at The Cardinal Wiseman School from Year 7 to Year 11 are expected to wear school uniform. School uniform must be purchased through the official school uniform suppliers (with the exception being shirts, socks and shoes). Please make sure that all your clothing is clearly marked with your name. Please be aware that if you do not wear the correct school uniform you may be placed in isolation until

the situation has been resolved.

No jewellery may be worn, except for medical bracelets and watches. Make-up and nail varnish may not be worn. No badges to be worn other than a small religious type.

Coats must be of a length that covers the Blazer. They must be completely plain black or navy and without stripes or motifs. If the coat has a fur trim, it must be the same colour as the coat. The material should be plain cotton/woollen or a similar looking synthetic material. Denim, leather, suede, fur and leather look "PVC" are unacceptable materials. In addition, tracksuits and tracksuit hooded tops are not acceptable for use as coats.

Uniform


- Royal blue blazer with an embroidered badge
- Plain white shirt (short or long sleeved are permitted) - collar fastening to tie
- Charcoal Grey trousers: no jeans or cords (from listed Suppliers)
- Optional item Cardinal Wiseman uniform skirt, which must be knee length and should not be altered. Available from listed suppliers
- . Medium grev 'V' neck jumper with blue trim - compulsory in Autumn & Spring terms
- Clip-on School tie colours as suppliers
- Black opaque or natural colour plain tights
- Formal white dress socks may be worn in warm weather
- Plain black, formal flat heeled shoes. Boots, plimsolls, Training shoes or flip flops are not allowed.
- Plain black or navy scarves. Plain black or navy woollen hat (no motifs)
- Protective clothing: Apron
- Summer Uniform: Jumpers are optional and hats are not to be worn in the summer term

- Navy Cardinal Wiseman Shorts
- White Socks

Optional sportswear

- ¼ Zip Navy Cardinal Wiseman Long Sleeve Training Top

Uniform


- No jewellery may be worn, except for watches.
- No earrings may be worn
- All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons.
- Coats must be long enough to cover the blazer;
 plain black or navy no motives or stripes
- Jumpers must be worn in Autumn and Winter terms
- Tracksuits and tracksuit hooded tops are not allowed
- Hats and scarves must be navy or black with no motifs and must not be worn in the summer term

There are twelve tutor groups in Year 7; six of the tutor groups will study French whilst the other six will study Spanish.

Whilst we will do our best to accommodate such requests, please be aware that this is not always possible due to the impact this has on class groupings.

Teaching groups

Groupings will be organised based SATs results and other data provided by your child's Primary School.

The structure at KS3 is as follows:

- Maths, Science and PE are taught in mixed ability groups
- English, RE, Geography, History, Spanish, French, Art, Drama, Music and PSHE are taught in three broad ability streams.
- DT and ICT are taught in smaller mixed ability groups



How can you support your child in their transition to the KS3 Curriculum?

National data has reported; "A learning loss of up to 2 months in reading in both primary and secondary schools". DFE 2021

- Literacy, reading and oracy remain an important focus
- KS3 students are expected to spend approximately 30 minutes reading per evening.

Please support us by maintaining your child's reading routines over the summer holiday, when they join us in September they will have access to an excellent library with a range of online and e-books available for them to satisfy their love of reading.

YOLO: Q&A App (17+)

Currently at the top of the App Store chart, YOLO: Q&A is a social networking app that is used with SnapChat (although not affiliated by Snapchat). YOLO is rated as 17+ in the app store, which means you should be at least 17 years old to download this app.

YOLO is an acronym for 'you only live once.' In YOLO, users request to "send me anonymous questions" which then posts the request in Snapchat (via their Snapchat story or to a group of friends). All questions are then sent via YOLO anonymously.

The NSPCC have issued a warning about this app as it can clearly be misused to send abusive or upsetting messages (Source: https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/technology-48214413).

Due to the nature of this app we would highly recommend that the age rating of this app is adhered to.

Instagram – Comment controls

Don't forget that Instagram include controls to help you manage comments on your posts. Select 'hide offensive comments' to automatically hide comments that may be offensive from your posts. You can also create your own list of words or emojis that you don't want to have appear in your comments. To access these filters, go to the settings menu, privacy and security and then select comment controls.

Use the S.H.A.R.E checklist

The government has released a S.H.A.R.E checklist to help you spot misleading news or information online to avoid it being shared.

When incorrect information is shared it can have serious consequences, for example it can lead to health scares and hoax stories

How Does It Work?

- You have a secure online account accessible 24/7
- We post items for payment to your account
- You then choose how to pay
- ParentPay keeps a record of all payments you make
- You have greater control of your account using automated email/SMS alerts

You will be sent a Parentpay card which you can top up, with cash or debit cards, at local Paypoint outlets


