It is with the greatest pleasure that I welcome you to the Cardinal Wiseman 6th Form prospectus. As Headteacher my commitment to you is that this institution will provide the high-quality teaching, guidance, and support to enable you to progress to either university or employment.

Our confidence in this commitment is based upon the 'Outstanding' judgment received from Ofsted in April 2024 as well as a record of consistently

exceptional A-level results. In 2025 for example, over 60% of students achieved A*-B grades, once more placing us in the top 10% of schools nationally.

The Sixth Form Team, led by Ms Theophilou, aim to position each student so that they have a range of opportunities at the end of Year 13. These will range from attending elite Russell Group Universities, including Oxbridge to high quality apprenticeships. There is no achievement ceiling for our Sixth Form students who are prepared to work hard.

Unlike most Sixth Forms we employ an experienced full time UCAS advisor, Ms Ghebree, to ensure that every student is given personalised guidance in relation to their pathways following A levels.

Our rich programme of enrichment and leadership opportunities helps students grow beyond the classroom and prepare for life beyond school.

Higher Education – UCAS & Careers Advice

The Cardinal Wiseman Sixth Form has an outstanding reputation when it comes to the university application process, UCAS.

Last year, 88% of our students secured a place at university - 34% of them going to their top two universities. Often, our students are the first in their family to attend university and we have high aspirations and expectations of all of them.

We have a full-time experienced and specialist UCAS Advisor, Ms Ghebree, who provides excellent guidance and support to all students completing their university application. We send off applications well in advance of the deadline which often results in our students being

made early offers. Ms Ghebree has developed strong links with a number of universities, including Imperial College London, Oxford and Cambridge, where Admissions Tutors invite our Y12 students to visit their campus to have a taste of university life, and provide them with support and advice to successfully win places at elite universities with interview preparation and personal statement workshops.

Furthermore, at the Cardinal Wiseman Sixth Form we run the Wiseman Lecture Series, a great enrichment and wider learning opportunity for our Sixth Form students, to listen to an in-person talk held by Speakers from different professional backgrounds (Banking,

Engineering, Law, Creative Arts/ Architects, Doctors, Nurses, etc.) whom willingly give up their time to come to our school and deliver insights of their daily jobs, their educational journey and career paths. This not only enriches the learning of our students but also widens their awareness of the many possible career paths they may embark on.

We regularly share with our students a number of opportunities for them to attend webinars, open days, residentials and work experience programs. We work in partnership with established providers who offer Sixth Form students' academic lectures, workshops, Apprenticeships and work experience opportunities.



We are proud to say that in Y12, our students successfully apply to Imperial to join their STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) Program, and to Kings College, to join their K+ mentoring scheme.

Furthermore, in Y12, after the final internal exams, we hold a rewarding UCAS and Careers Conference Week, for students to prepare for the important choices they will need to make in Y13.

During UCAS and Careers Conference Week, we invite universities, professionals from different backgrounds and Apprenticeship providers, to help inspire our students to aim high. Differently from the Wiseman Lecture Series, during UCAS Week, students have the chance to meet professionals in smaller groups of students and attend shorter sessions, providing them a 1-2-1 like atmosphere in the classroom and allowing them to connect with the speaker and have an interactive and

approachable experience, as well as hold a “mock interview” day where our students experience a professional interview within their field of study.

Additionally, we invite at least 2 universities to present what the benefits of going to university are, and what life as a ‘uni student’ is like. On average, the majority of our students’ progress on to university, some securing elite places at universities such as Oxford, Cambridge, Imperial, Bristol and UCL.

Last year we had two students progressing on to Oxford and one on to Cambridge. This is a fantastic achievement and one we are very proud of!

One of the key strengths of our Sixth Form is the pastoral support that the students receive as they are nurtured through what can be a very stressful period in their lives.

We are fortunate enough to have a Connexions advisor working in school, who regularly meets with students to provide careers advice.

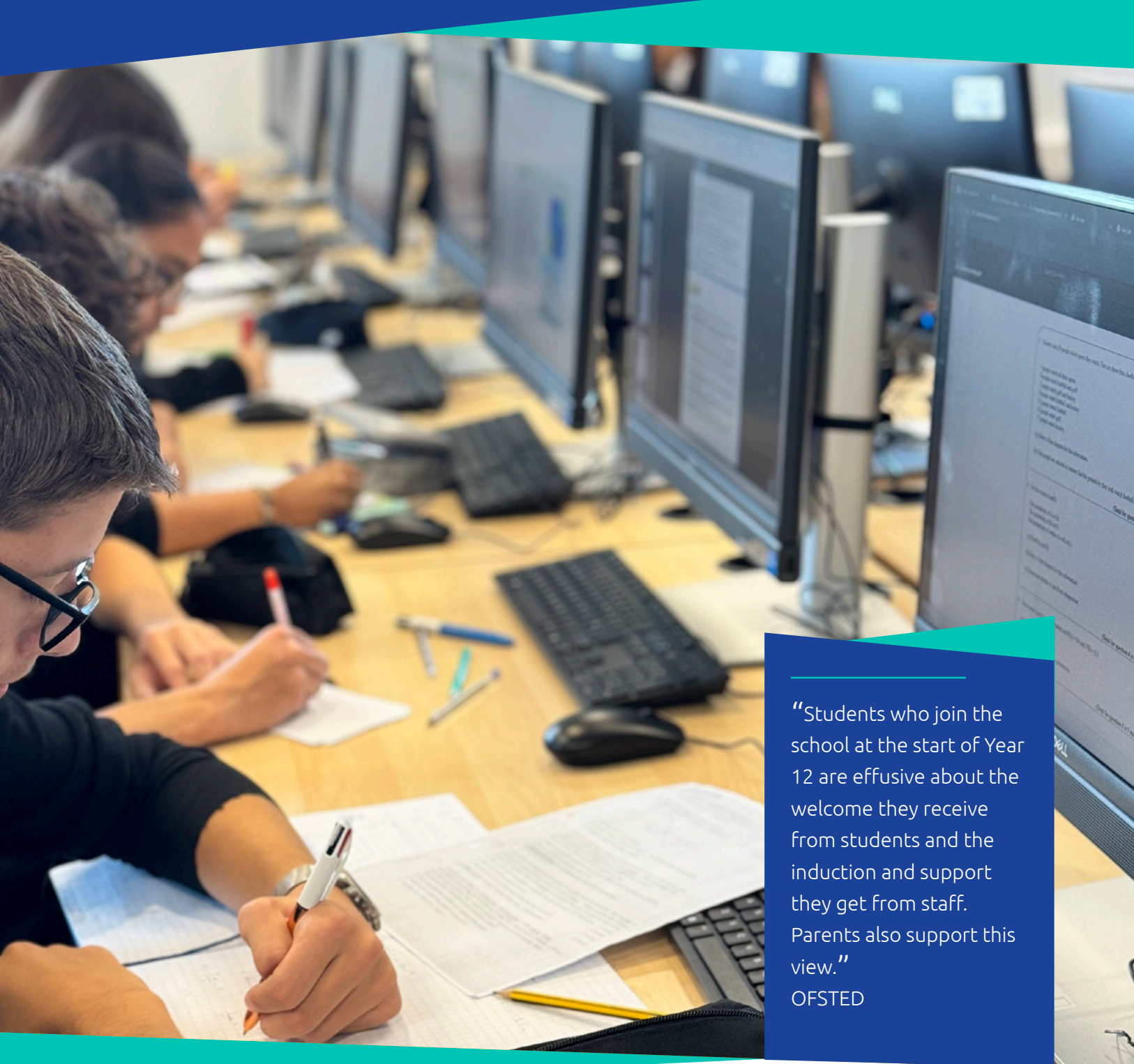
All students can undertake the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), enabling them to explore an academic research topic of their choice and develop valuable independent learning skills. Our students also take leading roles in a wide range of societies across the Arts, Community, and Sports, and contribute to a dynamic prefect team that plays an active part in shaping sixth form life, creating a vibrant, university-style community.

We are proud of our strong partnerships with local schools, where many of our students volunteer weekly to support young children with a range of physical and learning needs, fostering empathy, leadership, and social responsibility.

As part of developing our students into young academic scholars, we have developed our Wiseman Lecture Series program, shaped to reflect university style lectures and seminars. We host a vast range of experienced professionals from all fields of study and vocations to enrich, inspire and guide our students into the next stages of their lives, developing their knowledge portfolios and build that crucial wider learning experience that universities and employers require.

Our students partake in enrichment programs across the school and are particularly successful in debating and regularly running clubs for lower school students thereby developing their communication and leadership skills.

Learning facilities

The Sixth Form is split across two centres. Both buildings provide excellent learning facilities with study areas being based on ‘university libraries’.

Students can complete work in the centres during their timetabled or independent study periods.

There is access to computers, iPads and printers. As well as separate facilities to enable collaborative learning.

Our school boasts an extensive library equipped with a wide range of academic books, journals, and newspapers, providing students with the resources they need to excel in their studies.

Sixth Form students benefit from exclusive access to our dedicated learning portal, a dynamic platform offering daily lesson resources alongside an impressive range of work experience opportunities, career guidance, workshops, and Super Curriculum activities. This ensures every student is supported both academically and personally as they prepare for future success.
