The Real Schools Guide 2017 has released the definitive list of the best state-funded schools in west London.

The criteria for the list, compiled by getwestlondon's data unit, takes 50 different data points into account from GCSE performance to teacher-pupil ratios and absence rates.

St Mark's Catholic School, in Bath Road, Hounslow tops our 2017 list of best secondary schools. Second place on the prestigious annual list went to Ark King Solomon Academy in Marylebone while **Greenford's Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School took third place.**

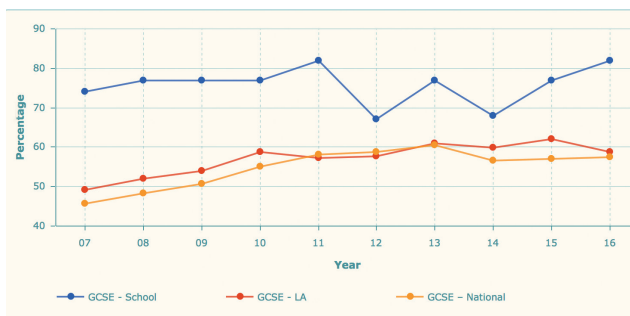
How have pupils at The Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School done in their GCSEs and how does it compare to local authority and national averages?

The government introduced the Attainment 8 measure in 2016. It measures pupil performance across maths, which is double weighted in the score, English, also double weighted, three qualifications included in the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) and three other approved qualifications (GCSE or equivalent). The higher the average score the better pupils at the school are doing.

In 2016 the average Attainment 8 score per pupil at The Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School was 58.

In 2016, the most recent results available, 82% of pupils at The Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School gained at least 5 A\* to C grade GCSEs including English and Maths. Nationally 57.4% of pupils achieved this.
