Code of Conduct 2023-24

- Involvement with drugs (possession, handling, concealing, using or dealing) and /or offensive weapons (any items made or adapted, for causing or intending to cause injury), persistent lack of co-operation, extreme acts of violence, assaults or serious/persistent cases of bullying or serious incidents of child on child sexual abuse will result in permanent exclusion from the school.
- In line with DfE and OFSTED guidance the school has a zero tolerance approach to child-on-child sexual abuse
- Serious incidents of child-on-child sexual abuse will result in permanent exclusion.
- Serious or repeated incidents of theft, will result in permanent exclusion.
- Other incidents of harmful sexual behaviour may result in permanent exclusion repeated incidents will result in permanent exclusion

- Grades' 7 9 in Maths = 43%
- Ebacc standard pass = 66%
- Ebacc strong pass = 54%






Extra-curricular provision

- Is your child able to articulate their key areas for development?


Positive Stress vs Negative Stress


- Exam board Edexcel

- Foundation groups: 5-7 [Grades 5-1]
- Solving problems in context an increased feature.





 Full programme of study topics with corresponding Maths Watch clips provided for each student and also available on SharePoint




Maths GCSE – Year 11 Focus




Maths GCSE – Keys to Success


Help with English revision
