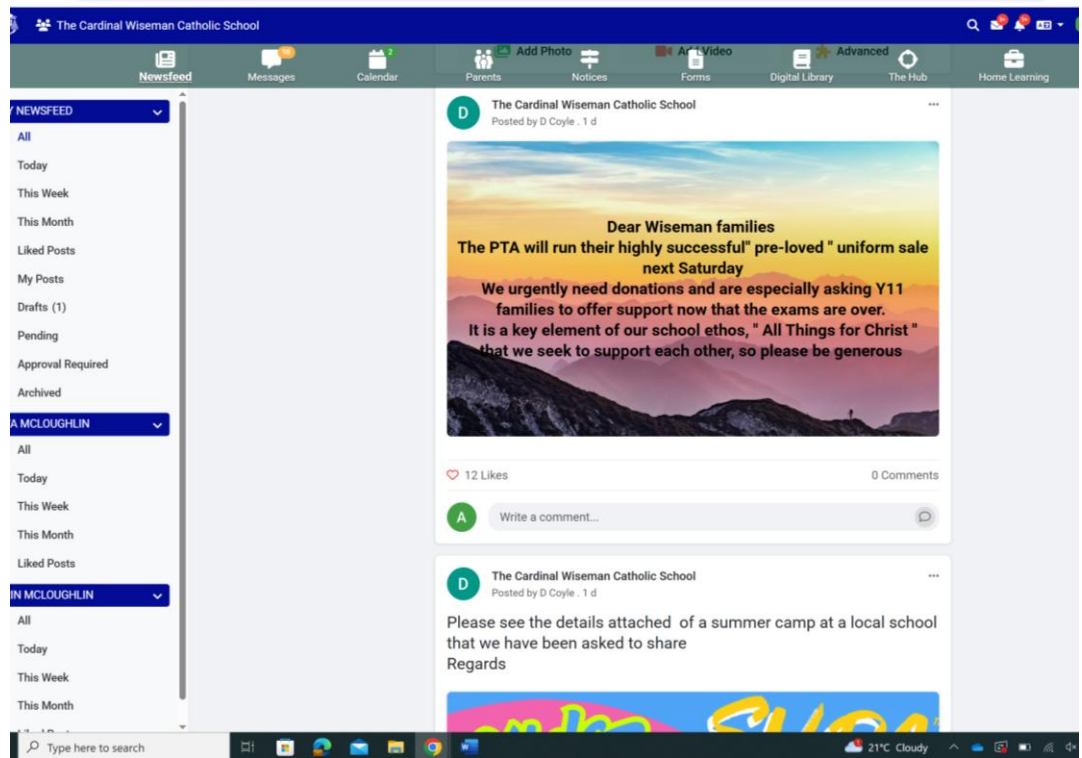

## School Uniform 2023/24

### Girls

#### Hair

- Decorations/accessories other than simple alics/hair bands are not permitted.
- Hair bands must be blue or black
- Unnatural hair colours and extensions will not be permitted

Earrings are not permitted

No makeup.

Plain white shirt without patterns or motifs

Clip-on school tie.

Royal blue blazer with an embroidered badge.

Skirts MUST fall on or below the knee and should not be altered

Plain black opaque tights or formal white dress socks may be worn

### Boys

Plain black or navy scarves. Plain black or navy woollen hats (no motifs or caps). Hats and scarves are not permitted in the summer term.

Plain white shirt, collar fastening to tie

Clip-on school tie.

Medium grey 'V' neck jumper with blue trim

Royal blue blazer with an embroidered badge.

Cardinal Wiseman uniform trousers must be purchased from official suppliers: Juniper or PMG.



Formal, plain black flat heeled shoes (with black laces where applicable). Trainers, plimsolls, boots or flip-flops are not permitted.

## We have a unisex uniform policy but please note:

- **No earrings allowed** (No allowance will be made for recent piercings that will therefore close over).
- Boys trousers must be worn with a plain black or brown belt. Trousers should be worn above their hips (no sagging trousers)
- Shorts or tracksuit bottoms are not permitted under school trousers
- Ensure coats bought are plain black or navy

**ENGLISH**

Helping your child succeed at English

Year 7	Year 7 present stories over time. A study of diverse poetry. Novel: <i>In the Sea there are Crocodiles</i> by Fabio De Luigi Shakespeare and the Elizabethan Theatre: <i>Much Ado About Nothing</i>
Year 8	Who We Are: A study of our identity. Novel: <i>A Monster Calls</i> by Patrick Ness. Shakespeare: <i>Romeo and Juliet</i> Language with <i>Friday</i> your voice.
Year 9	YEAR 9 GCSE Topics Through Our Eyes: Being Different: A study of human experiences. GCSE Poetry: Love and Relationships (Early poems) 20th Century play: <i>An Inspector Calls</i> by J.B. Priestley Prophet and Lullabies: writing from a point of view. Debate competition (Inter-year)

In Year 7 English lessons at Cardinal Wiseman students will be studying exciting literature such as William Shakespeare's *Much Ado About Nothing* and *In the Sea there are Crocodiles*. Students will also study a range of poetry over time and work on improving written and verbal communication.

In English, from Year 7 to Year 11 our intent is that students will be encouraged to read widely for pleasure as well as study a range of texts with a view to developing a love of literature and an understanding how writers create. Students will use their reading skills to help improve writing skills to ensure we fully succeed when leaving Year 11 for further education and to enter a fulfilling career.

All students will need to have a black or blue writing pen, a highlighter pen, some coloured pencils, a ruler and a green pen. Students will need to bring back books to borrow one from an extremely well-stocked library for a reading activity at the start of each lesson.

**HISTORY**

Helping your child succeed at History!

Year 7	Medieval period in Britain and beyond. Invasions of Britain Invasions by Romans, Vikings, Saxons and the Normans Democracy in Britain Medieval Islamic world through the Crusades and the West African kingdoms.
Year 8	Early modern period of British and World History. Reigns of the Tudor and Stuart monarchy 17th and 18th century and the British Empire (slave trade) 19th and 20th century and the birth of the chartists and suffragettes.
Year 9	Modern British and World History First World War Weimar government Rise of Hitler and the Nazi Party Second World War Holocaust and the persecution and discrimination of Jews during the 20th century. The Cold War.

With reference to this Burkean quotation, the History department is conscious of the role it plays in introducing students to the significant developments of the past that shape the society in which we live. # Important reminders for Induction Day

1. Students must be in primary school uniform
2. 8:50am start
3. Students must bring in a (nut free) packed lunch and water bottle
4. **If your child requires emergency medication, they will need to attend the medical room before they go anywhere else on site. Medical will be open from 8.15. They MUST have their emergency medication with them.**
5. Finish at 2:50pm
6. If you wish for your child to go home on their own – they must have a note on their person. Students being picked up by a sibling can remain in the hall

This includes Epipens (with care plan), asthma pumps and any other medication. They can either leave these in medical or keep their box on them.

**Without their emergency meds and care plan, students will remain in the medical room until received.**
